Exodus 35:1 - 40:38

- 1. This section discusses with great detail how Moses (and the people) fulfilled God's commands for building the Tabernacle
- 2. Note that the whole enterprise begins with keeping the Sabbath.
- 3. Worship is grounded in the commandment to set aside time, space, and energy for God
- 4. Whereas the people, in making the Golden Calf, broke their relationship with God, here, after God has restored the relationship, the people now respond faithfully and willingly
- 5. Note the DIFFERENCES in the people's creation of the Golden Calf and in God's creation of the Tabernacle:
 - a. Calf:
 - i. People's initiative
 - ii. Aaron commands gold
 - iii. No planning
 - iv. Made quickly
 - v. Immediate accessibility
 - vi. Visible god
 - vii. Impersonal object
 - b. Tabernacle:
 - i. God's initiative
 - ii. A willing offering requested
 - iii. Painstaking preparations
 - iv. Lengthy building process
 - v. Safeguarding of divine holiness
 - vi. Invisible God
 - vii. Personal, active God
- 6. God makes the peoples' obedience possible through God's gracious provision of all that is needed for the Tabernacle and for worship therein
- 7. The point of the Tabernacle is not the "thing" per se, but the relationship that the thing presupposes and then nurtures
- 8. Notice that GOD is the one who is the originating source of all that now happens and when the Tabernacle is complete, there is not even room for Moses inside
- 9. Though God is present everywhere, still, God provides a particular place, space, and time for his presence
- 10. God is now present with the whole community (not just Moses & Aaron)
- 11. God will make himself known, and will do what he will do
- 12. Though God's presence is mysterious and not controlled by human action, still God's presence is also knowable, and unmistakable
- 13. God is present in a moveable worship space God is "on the move" with a people who are "on the move"

- A. How might your own worship of God in the present day be enriched by this knowledge of Israel's ancient worship?
- B. Are there items in your life that are particularly precious and meaningful in your relationship with God?
- C. Where is God with you today and where are you with God today as your life moves forward?
