Luke 10:25-37 (NT pg. 96)

The Good Samaritan

Who is my neighbor? Who can it be?
Who should I love in word and deed?
Is it my friend or is it my foe?
Who is my neighbor, and just how far should my love go?

Jesus said the most important thing that we can do
is love the Lord with all our hearts
and love our neighbor too.
A lawyer tried to justify his lack of love for all.
